## Supporting children with neurodivergent profiles

Year groups have successfully trialled two approaches in class supporting children with neurodivergent profiles. Our Local Authority advisor has met with some of the children and has noted how well the children have responded to visual timetables, so they know which teacher is teaching them and the order of lessons for the day.

## E-Safety

We have been busy booking some exciting school trips for different year groups. The booking system for these trips will now be on Arbor. It is vital for parents to have the Arbor app set up and ensure that notifications are turned on in the settings. Arbor is now our main communication system, where you can receive important messages, view your child's attendance, and update crucial information such as telephone numbers, medical details, allergies, etc. It is the parents' responsibility to check and update this information promptly whenever changes arise, as this data will be used for school trips.



## Extending the school day

Just to remind you that the 'Extending the School Day' consultation period has now closed, and timings are detailed below which will be in place from 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2025:

### Infants

Parents can enable push notifications when installing the Parent App on their phone, which means **parents/guardians will be instantly notified when a new in-app message has been sent** (whether logged in or not).

To enable notifications on the Arbor Parent App, you'll need to enable push notifications within your phone's permission settings.

For example, on a Samsung Galaxy, you would go to Settings > Apps > Arbor > Notifications and toggle the push notifications switch to the "on" position.

On an iPhone, the path is Settings > Arbor > Notifications, and you would also toggle the push notifications switch. When downloading the app, you'll also receive a prompt to allow push notifications, so make sure to select "Allow" at that time.



## Attendance

Our whole school attendance figures are currently - Infants 93.1% and Juniors 94.6%. The average attendance Nationally remains at 94.8% and for Hampshire Primary Schools for the same period remains at 95.3%. Our targets are 95% for both schools, we must work together to see an improvement for our children. Mrs Johnson will continue to contact all families where individual child attendance is below 95% to offer support and where appropriate invite to support sessions. We need to advise the Local Authority when certain 'triggers' are met e.g. child is likely to hit 15 days of illness absence.

We analyse children's absence patterns; and if appropriate contact sibling schools to try and get a wider understanding of why a child's absences have increased. Children can attend school when unwell with coughs, colds and sore throats. It is when you decide that your child is too unwell for school that they should stay at home - you can find more advice here:
