The School Nursing Team have bookable clinic sessions available across the day on the 3rd December. Please note that this is now available to parents of both infant and junior aged children. Please contact the school office if you would like to book a consultation. They can offer advice and signposting on a range of issues including:

- Relationships, sexual health, and substance misuse
- Parenting advice: accident prevention, sleep,
- Children and young people with complex or additional health needs
- Support for children and young people not in school, in accessing the Healthy Child Programme.

Smartphone Free Childhood

We are committed to ensuring our primary schools are smartphone free by January 2026, meaning that we do not want primary school children to bring a smartphone to school. I have asked the presenter to come back to Springwood on Wednesday 26th October, he will be based in the Junior Hall during Parent Consultations, so please do drop in to find out more.

If you need to contact your child while they travel to and from school, a simple 'brick' phone is more than enough. 'Brick' phones do not have internet connectivity, and they are inexpensive. There are a few phones that look like smartphones but are not. Here are some examples of the more popular non-smart phones:

It is imperative that we are able to contact an adult to collect the child should they develop symptoms and to safeguard all children.
