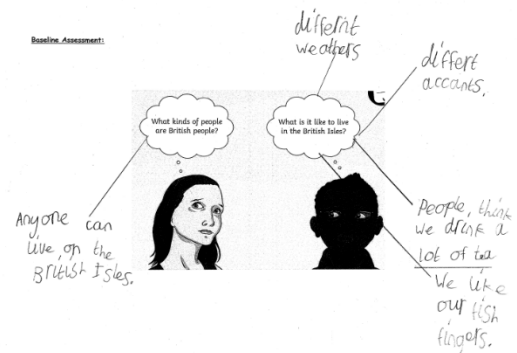
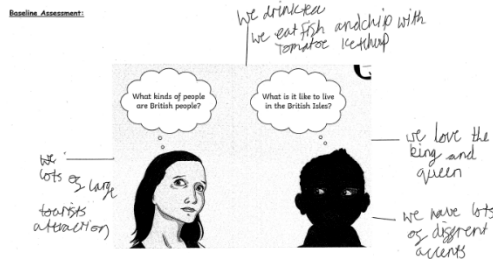
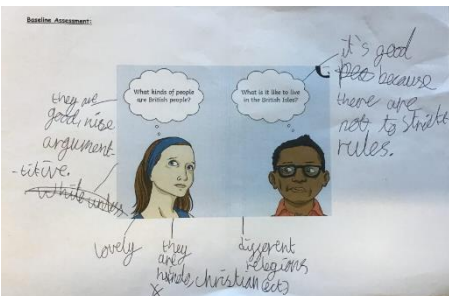
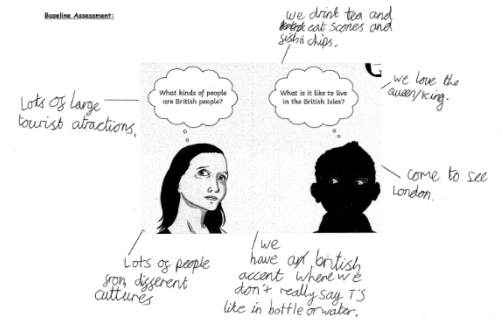
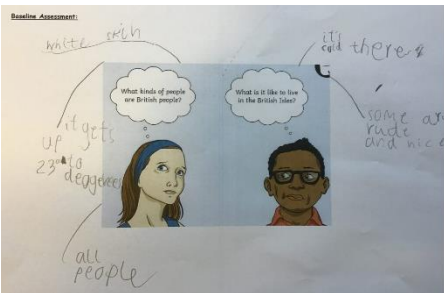
In this unit of work pupils will learn:

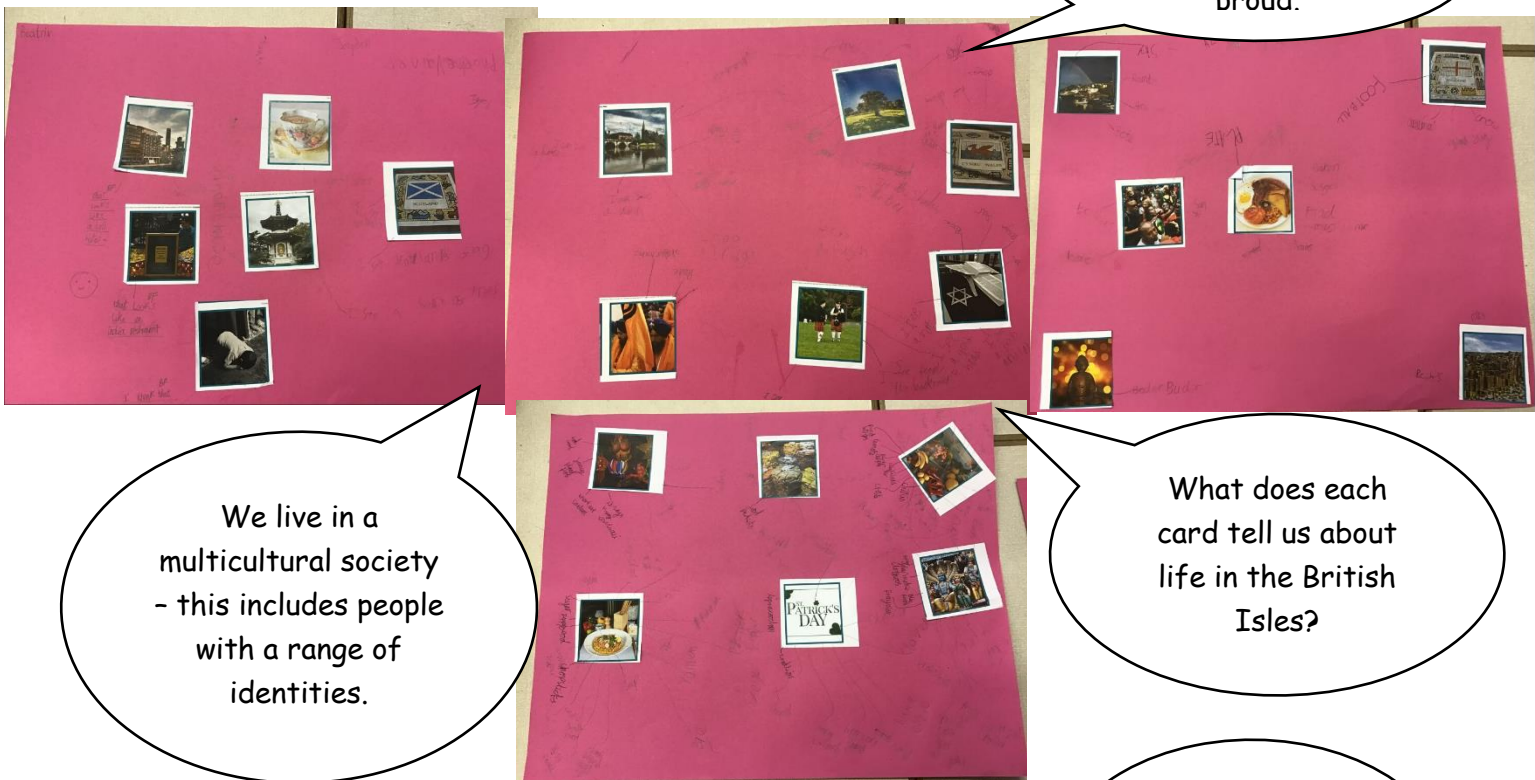
Activity 1

Can you describe what it is like to live in the British Isles?

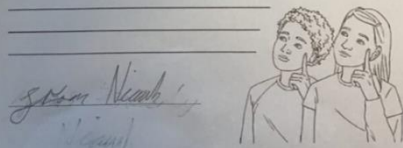
